2. Aperio WebViewer Release 1.2 overview

The Aperio WebViewer Release 1.2 includes the following new features and updates:

Z-stack image viewing and navigation support

Prior to Aperio WebViewer Release 1.2, you could open and view z-stack images in Aperio WebViewer; however, you could not navigate through and view the z-stack layers.

With Release 1.2, Aperio WebViewer now fully supports z-stack image viewing and navigation. The following sections in this document describe how to use this new feature.

3. Overview of z-stack images

Many digital slide scanners can produce z-stack images. Z-stack images are comprised of multiple digital images of slide tissue scanned at different focal depths, creating a 3D composite multiplane image that you can visually navigate through much as a microscope user can navigate through different tissue focal depths by using the microscope objective fine and coarse adjustments.

With Aperio WebViewer Release 1.2, pathologists and researchers can review slide samples at varied "heights" using a software focus adjustment, comparable to the fine-focus knob of a conventional light microscope.

For all types of scanning, the scanner determines the layer within the tissue that provides the optimal focus—this is called the best focus layer. When you initially open a z-stack image in Aperio WebViewer, the image opens to the best focus layer. The number of layers and the layer separation (depth, in microns (µm), between the layers) is set during scanning.

4. View and navigate z-stack image layers

This section describes how to open, view, and navigate z-stack images.

Open z-stack images




You must use Aperio eSlide Manager to open a case, project, or individual slide images to view in Aperio WebViewer. For more details about using Aperio eSlide Manager, see the *Aperio eSlide Manager User's Guide*.

Follow these steps to open and view a z-stack image in Aperio WebViewer:

- 1. Log in to Aperio eSlide Manager.
- 2. Locate the Case or Project that contains the z-stack images you want to view.
- 3. Click the from the Case or Project to open the slide images in Aperio WebViewer.


Aperio WebViewer opens the Case or Project in a separate browser tab. You can identify an image as a z-stack image by the presence of the Focus slider, as shown in the example below.



When Aperio WebViewer opens a z-stack image, it initially displays the best focus layer by default. Use the Focus slider to navigate to and view each layer of the z-stack image. The Focus slider handle indicates the active layer number. For instructions on viewing the different z-stack layers, see the next section, View z-stack image layers.


View z-stack image layers

You navigate through the layers of a z-stack image using the new Focus slider. The Focus slider appears in the Viewer window only when you are viewing a z-stack image.



Follow these steps to view each layer of your z-stack image:

1. Click the Focus slider handle and drag it left or right to view each layer of the image.



The number on the Focus slider handle indicates the current z-stack layer. (You can also use keyboard shortcuts to view different layers. See Keyboard shortcuts for z-stack image navigation.)

As you move through each layer of the image, the focus changes in the Viewer window.

Annotate z-stack images

You can use the Aperio WebViewer Annotation tools on z-stack images the same way you use them on other images. Any annotations you add to a z-stack images are visible on all layers of the image.

Keyboard shortcuts for z-stack image navigation

The following new keyboard shortcuts are available for navigation z-stack layers, as an alternative to using the Focus slider.

- Alt + Plus Sign to navigate the Focus slider to the right to view the upper z-stack layers.
- Alt + Minus Sign to navigate to the Focus slider to the left to view the lower z-stack layers.
- Alt + 0 to navigate to the best focus layer.

Conferencing

The Aperio WebViewer Conferencing feature does not support a shared view of z-stack image navigation.
